Course Objectives:

1. Given one of the five basic woodwind instruments (flute, oboe, clarinet, bassoon and saxophone) the student will be able to demonstrate the following with 100% accuracy: a. Assembly techniques, b. Embouchure formation, c. Tone production, d. Posture, e. Hand position, f. Fundamental ability to play the instrument correctly, g. Standard and important alternate fingerings.

2. Students will diagnose and prescribe remedies for individual problems of each instrument in the areas of intonation, embouchure, technique, tuning, tone production, fingerings, and beginner qualifications and aptitude.

3. Students should be able describe proper materials and techniques for instrument care and the adjustment of single and double reeds.

4. Students will be able to demonstrate knowledge of literature for each instrument.

Required Materials

Reeds for oboe and bassoon.

Methods of Evaluation:

Attendance: Attendance is mandatory. If you must miss a class, please leave a message or note in advance. Absences will be excused at the discretion of the instructor. Each unexcused absence will lower your total grade by .5 letter for each occurrence.

Written Tests: There will be a written take-home test for each woodwind instrument. **30% of grade.**

Lesson: During finals week students in the class will give a 10 minute lesson to a student volunteer. You may teach a lesson of any level. You will be expected to actively address issues which arise in the lesson. **10% of grade.**

Playing Evaluations: Students will be asked to play individually in each class session (brief excerpts of class exercises and/or a solo work) **20% of grade.** At the conclusion of each instrument instruction sequence the student will play privately for the instructor. **20% of grade.** Criteria for evaluation will include proficiency and "correctness" of technique.

Forum Discussion: Students will participate in weekly forum discussions on Moodle. Topics will include analyzing video performances of beginning and intermediate level instrumentalists, and sharing of helpful pedagogical articles and videos. **20% of grade**

Practice: A <u>minimum</u> of twenty minutes 5 times per week will be needed in order to successfully meet the performance expectations of the class. It is important that the student learn basic fingerings as soon as possible. At the beginning it will be better to work in two tenminute blocks. As your embouchure develops you may choose to practice for twenty minutes at one session.
