Course Requirements:

- For the semester students are required to complete the following;
- Four short solo pieces for different instruments of the orchestra
- One work (minimum) for AbletonLive
- One chamber work for 3 or more instruments at least seven minutes in length

A completed work will consist of a finished computer desktop published score with dynamics, articulations, tempo markings and performance instructions written at an upper division class level.

- One piano piece arranged for orchestra
- Submit 1 entry (minimum) to the DeLodder or a different competition
- One score analysis

Students are required to have at least one piece performed on the Composers Recital; Friday April 7, 2017 at 8:00 pm. in FRH. Students are also required to have at least one work performed on the student composer read through session scheduled for Monday, May 1, 2017 from 8:00-10:00 p.m. For both recitals it will be the student's responsibility to find the performers, and organize rehearsals.

Attendance to all lessons is imperative. Attendance to all composition recitals including student senior recitals is required. Each unexcused absence beyond the one excused absence will result in the reduction of 10 points from the attendance portion of the final grade.

An absolute minimum of one hour of composition is required to-be done daily. First and second semester students please send your daily sketches to me at jbp5@humboldt.edu everyday Monday-Friday. I will do my best to return comments quickly. Third and fourth semester students will need to bring 5 melodies or chord progressions (my choice) to the lesson every week. This work can be done on a major composition or simply sketches of musical ideas.
