Grades: Your final grade will be based on the following:

- 1) Practice time and practice journals—40% of final grade
You are required to practice at least 90 minutes each week, spread over at least five days a week. Practice time is self-reported in practice journals, which are due at the beginning of class each Tuesday.
- 2) Class participation – 30%
You earn a point for each class in which you participate. At the end of the semester, half of your final grade will be based on points earned divided by number of classes attended.
- 3) Skills – 20%
Various skills will be introduced in class throughout the semester, and you will be assessed on those skills after an appropriate amount of time.
- 4) Concert attendance – 6%
Each concert attended is worth 2%. You can earn 2% extra credit for each concert attended above the required number of three.
- 5) Workshop attendance – 4%
Each workshop attended is worth 2%. You can earn 2% extra credit for each workshop attended above the required number of two.
