Course description:

"Instruction in brass instrumental techniques and pedagogy"

372B is the first semester of a two semester course. It is designed for Music Majors in the Education Option.

We will cover primarily the commonly used brass instruments: trumpet/cornet, horn, trombone, euphonium/baritone and tuba. We will also study less common members of the family: flugelhorn, sousaphone and the British Brass Band instrumentarium.

Most important topics are: 1) how to play the instruments; 2) how to practice them; 3) how to take care of them and 4) teaching techniques.

Course format:

Part lecture/demonstration, part in-class activity (playing), part "homework" (practice) and both written and performance tests.

Course objectives:

- 1. Learn the history of brass instruments and the basic physics of their operation.
- 2. Learn and use terminology pertaining to brass instruments.
- 3. Play with a stable, well-controlled sound, at varied volumes and with good intonation.
- 4. Correctly perform at least 4 major scales on your main instrument
- 5. Correctly perform a chromatic scale of 1-1/2 octaves.
- 6. Know and demonstrate basic transpositions for brass instruments
- 7. Identify and describe basic mutes and other techniques used to modify brass tone quality

Requirements:

- 1. Attendance is mandatory.
- 2. Please arrive in time to begin promptly.
- 3. Bring all required materials every class session.
- 4. Be silent when listening to music in class whether the performance is live or recorded.

Required texts and equipment:

- 1. Essential Elements 2000 method book (available after the first class session)
- 2. Instrument: we will begin with either trumpet or trombone; these will be assigned at the first class meeting
- 3. Maintenance supplies; discussed at first class meeting

Other class policies:

- 1. Cell phones OFF
- 2. No food/drink except water.
- 3. No photos/audio recording/video recording.
