

Syllabus: MUS 460: Expanded Repertoire

Basic Information

MUS 460: Expanded Repertoire is an optional co-requisite for students enrolled in 400-level studio lessons (MUS 420 – 438); the purpose of the course is to offer an additional unit of academic credit to students who are doing at least double the amount of practice and performing that is expected of students enrolled in upper division studio lessons. Taking MUS 460 does not make the studio lesson longer; it simply provides credit to students who are doing more than one unit's worth of practice and performance. In addition, MUS 460 *cannot* substitute for a required semester of MUS 420-438.

To register for this course, you will need to complete the Music Department's Contract for MUS 460: Expanded Repertoire, which is available in the Music Department Office. On this form, the student and the studio teacher will describe the additional practice time and performance expectations associated with the course. You may be expected to document your additional practice time. Your grade for this course will be distinct from the grade you earn for the co-requisite studio lesson and will reflect your accomplishment of the additional expectations described on the contract for MUS 460. The grade will be assigned by your studio teacher.
